Budget Vote

Contained herein is the budget for the 2012 Paradise Service Associates Corporation. Neither your dues nor your water billing will increase with this budget. The board unanimously accepted this budget. You will see further explanations within this newsletter of specific items being addressed. Please vote as soon as possible as ballots will be counted at a December 17th board meeting. If you want your vote to be anonymous, put the ballot

in an envelope and sign *it* instead of the ballot and put it in the mailing envelope. Even though the budget enclosed shows the water system also, you are voting on the 2012 annual dues.(General/Park) The water system is billed separately. The yearly dues invoices will go out with the January water billing. Be sure to write/mail 2 checks. Both made out to PSA but mailed to NWWS. (Address listed further in this newsletter)

The Board would like to Thank Nancy Fullerton for, not only her years of service, but her attention to detail, her excellent organizational skills and making the transition to the new treasurer so smooth. The current Finance Committee made up of the current and past 2 treasurers reviewed the books and found nothing out of the ordinary. The board would also like to say a very BIG THANK YOU to Bill Davies for his hard work and perseverance in the past several years in seeing the water system upgrade through! Next time you see either one of these folks, say "thank you".

Water Report

In taking over as PSA water chairman for the past 3 months, I can tell you that our water system is in excellent shape thanks to the hard work of Bill Davies and his Committee. However, there is still work to be done in order to actually have a fully operational and fully completed water system with proper, expected water pressure for all members, even when the power is out, as well as meeting State guidelines for backflow suppression. Some of the work being performed at the moment:

- installation of meters on lots that were missed during the upgrade
- Fixing a couple of crossed lines that were hooked up incorrectly.

- Identifying meters that were set too high which in the winter could cause them to freeze and break;
- Those will be re-set.

I am pleased to announce that PSA has joined Evergreen Rural Water of Washington. They provide technical assistance, training and leak detection among other items to many water systems in Washington State. They will be reviewing our system shortly and will be providing direction and advice. This is an extremely low cost service with huge advantages.

Some of the projects that have been identified to start this next year upon budget approval are: Fire

Hydrant and Blow Off painting, Generator purchase and install on well site #1, Pressure Relief Valves (PRV's) engineering and installing on main distribution lines, installation of Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) on well site 1 and 2, and calibration and verification of well 1 meter.

This is a lot of work for a small committee to do; we would like to have as much involvement from the community as possible. We recognize the hard work of the past Water Committees and are asking that new blood step up to help out. Please contact me if you would like to volunteer. rskoenig@gmail.com

Change in bookkeeping

The board of directors has approved an addendum to the contract with Northwest Water Systems to perform all bookkeeping services for our association for the next year. They currently do this for 30 of their 140 customers. The board

Water rates and usage

You will see a change in how you are billed for water. Since our Articles of Incorporation tells us we must pass along our services at cost, you will see the base water use rate at \$15/month. This is calculated by taking the projected cost (water budget herein) and dividing it by the 215 approved connections. The remaining \$15/month is charged to all 228

lots and will be applied to our reserve accounts to be spent on such items mentioned above such as the generator, pressure reducing stations, emergency reserves and replacement reserves.

Although the Board has not been officially presented with the initiative to increase the allowed

water use for the base rate, the Board is aware of the desires of the community on this front. The Board, at the November 5th meeting agreed to investigate the State's guidelines of water use for average households and to bring into alignment PSA's allowable base water rate with those at the next board meeting.
