The Neighborhood Block Watch consists of two Co-managers and 11 captains. Between all of us, we cover the entire Paradise Shores community. The group has been active since mid-August, 2021. Upon the advice of Sergeant William Reed - our contact with the Mason County Sherrif's Department - we also created a Block Watch Facebook page for the Block Watch members. He suggested this would be a great place to communicate with each other and save pertinent materials such as photos of incidences. There are two Block Watch members who we still need to add to the FB page.

We had several incidences reported in the middle of August. Those incidences were collected in a spreadsheet then reported to Sergeant Reed. Since then, things had been quiet until around October 21 thru November 5. Most of the incidences involved theft (or attempted theft) of gasoline from our member's vehicles/boats (one was theft of a contractor's tools). All incidences were recorded on my spreadsheet and then sent to Sergeant Reed on November 9th. He replied and said, "I will pass on the info to the other shifts in hopes of getting some more Law Enforcement presence out there".

Of course, the Block Watch Co-managers and Captains will continue to respond to our members' concerns and share them with the Mason County Sherrif's Department.
