The Neighborhood Block Watch consists of two Co-managers and 11 captains. all - but one - of the captains has access to our “private” FB page where we retain records of photos and incident reporting.

Reports of incidences were rather low these past couple of months in PSA. In fact, I have only two incidences reported since March. Both involved the same PSA member! I will wait until the end of May to send my report to the Mason County Sheriff's Office. In the meantime, I have seen reports from outside our community. When I see these, I post them to our “private” FB page just to memorialize what is also happening adjacent to our community.

My husband and I have placed four Neighborhood Watch signs throughout our community. One is on the fence at the Park along Mason Lake Drive, one on the fence at the main water well along Olympic Drive, one on a post along the water-line property on Lakeview Ave, and one right at the entrance to Mason Lake Dr from Mason Lake Road. (Did you know there is an older sign there from the past?) I think our brighter iteration of the Neighborhood Watch sign will attract more views.
