

## Water Committee Report

16 May 2026

During the last two months, 58 days (February 24<sup>th</sup> to April 23<sup>rd</sup>), our well pumps pumped a total of 9,571,641 gallons out of the ground.

One account exceeded their allotment. Usage was 29,531 cubic feet (200,907 gallons), averaging 3,809 gallons per day.

17 accounts are past due, zero are pending service suspension. Two accounts are suspended. Total outstanding amount is \$3,970.16.

Our five water system reserve CDs have gained an additional \$3,553.95 for the months of March and April.

Members are urged to turn off their water at the meter if they intend to leave for an extended period. Turning off your water will help prevent leaks and Thousands of dollars in water charges and possible costly repairs.

I encourage people to contact myself or NorthWest Water if they experience any water system problems. Please provide location and pictures if possible.

We had a leak in the vicinity of 471 E Mason Lake Dr 2 weeks ago. NWS reported onsite within 45 minutes and had the leak fixed and the lines flushed with 1 hour of reporting. The break occurred along the PVC threads of a male PVC connection into the brass female connection for the water meter. NWS flushed the affected portion by disconnecting the piping from the water meter and flushing water through the piping then reconnected it to the water meter.

Our pump system has been working well over the last 2 months proving that the adjustments made by NWS to our pump controllers were a good investment to prevent needless cycling of the backup pump. I will continue to monitor the system as we move into summer and usage increases.
